

Be Prepared for a Disaster



Fall topic: Shelter in Place

In the event of a chemical, biological, or radiological threat, the public may be directed to shelter in place at home. This requires some planning and a few supplies. Choose an interior "safe room," preferably with few or no windows or doors that open to outdoors. Have some snacks, water, and a battery-powered radio available for use in the safe room. Also have some plastic sheeting and tape ready to

seal up windows, doors, vents, and electrical outlets in the room. When directed, close all exterior doors and windows, turn off all ventilation, enter and seal the safe room, turn on the radio and await instructions from emergency management. Shelter in place incidents are rare and most last only a few hours. <u>Learn more about emergency preparedness in Bellingham and Whatcom County here.</u>

Sunnyland's Enchanted Garden Shop



The Garden Spot was founded by Marcy Plattner over 35 years ago and has been a Bellingham staple and a gathering place for friends and gardeners ever since. In 1985, Marcy opened the first Garden Spot Nursery in Wallingford Center in Seattle. Five years later she opened a second seasonal location in Sunnyland Square where Cruising Coffee is now located. After a few years, Marcy sold the Seattle Garden Spot location and the Bellingham location moved down the street to the corner of Alabama and King Street. In January 2021, she sold the business to longtime employee, Paige Lanham.

Garden Spot may be a plant business, but what makes it special is the people. The nursery has always been a place for friends to meet, mentorships to form, and people to make face to face connections. New owner, Paige Lanham, says she had never worked in a place like this with an emphasis on people, above all else, and it's what she wanted to preserve and enhance about the nursery when she bought it. Paige says Garden Spot is so excited to partner with SNA on the Sunnyland Garden Club because "communicating directly with new and experienced gardeners in our neighborhood is the best way to key in to what people need and what they want to learn." Paige says she's made her focus education, community, and environmental stewardship because these are the things that help us grow as a people and as a planet. "I feel so lucky to be able to pursue these goals in my business and let these motivations guide everything that we do."

Garden Spot strives to make the nursery a bright respite from the wet Pacific Northwest winters. "What better time of year to highlight the beauty of the season and provide a magical place for people to be in the moment with their loved ones?" Paige reports "a big part of the winter holidays for us is giving back to our community, so a portion of our Christmas Tree sales go to the Bellingham Boys and Girls Club and we have a new tradition of doing a fundraiser for the Alternative Humane Society." SNA has been grateful for Garden Spot's support of our annual Earth Day Celebration, and is excited to partner with them for our new Sunnyland Garden Club.

Help Create the Plan for Bellingham's Future

Bellingham is updating its Comprehensive Plan, the document used to guide growth toward a twenty-year vision for the future. This update is due in 2025 and will guide development, capital investments, city programs, and other actions across the city as we work toward the vision for 2045. Each phase of the project will include opportunities for engagement with the broader community alongside technical work completed by staff. **COB staff will present info and gather feedback at our quarterly neighborhood meeting. Share Your Thoughts with Bellingham City Council

Did you know there are several ways to communicate with City Council?

- 1. Attend City Council <u>meetings</u>.or view them via <u>BTV Bellingham</u> or Zoom.
- 2. Speak to the City Council at public comment periods scheduled during each regular City Council meeting or at scheduled public hearings. Instructions for meeting access is provided on the <u>City's meetings page</u> and in each City Council meeting agenda.
- 3. <u>Use the Engage Bellingham portal</u>: provide written comments that will be visible to all users of that site.
- 4. Email the full City Council at ccmail@cob.org(External link) or email your councilor directly. Sunnyland is divided between Wards 2 and 3.

Sunnyland Development Updates:

Jerns redevelopment update

The permit application was submitted in late summer and COB is currently awaiting response to their Request for Information., which must occur by mid-December.

A public comment period is expected to occur in early 2024.

Sunset Commons update

The developer anticipates starting the vertical construction of 12 townhouses along Sunset Drive in early 2024, and anticipates construction of each townhouse to take 8-12 months.

Easily Report Non-Emergency Issues

COB contracts with SeeClickFix to make it easier for residents to report non-emergency issues such as abandoned vehicles, pothole repairs, and graffiti.

Let the City know what you think should be fixed; it's easy! Upload pictures of the problem, select the location on a map, add a description, and you're done!
